We want to communicate this more to educate everyone that uses the trails. There was a motion to rescind item number 11 from May 15,2024, but this was not an action item on the agenda. Director Wallace will take this information and talk to the City Administrator.
6. UPDATE: Riders Club Projects: Red Rock trail is looking ok from the Riders Club; people are using it and riding on it. The Riders Club will be monitoring the trail. South Shelter has the outside up and they are working on the inside. They have a goal of a finish date for Labor Day.
7. UPDATE: Trail Maintenance: John T is mowing and maintain the hiking trails and the horse park. A request was made to have the fire nettles be cut down on the Red Rock trail. Dennis K said that the DOC will take care of this when they are out at the park next.
8. UPDATE: Scouts September Recruitment Day: Mike Mara explained what recruitment day would look like and what activities they would be doing. They have it scheduled for September 7 and will be out there for about 4 hours.

3. Rent and Fees

- a. Lessee agrees to pay Lessor the amount of \$0.20 per square foot of leased space, based on the footprint of the Lessee's hangar, for a total of \$_____, payable annually in advance on or before January 2, for the duration of the term of this Agreement. No demand for payment need at any time be given; it shall be the duty of the Lessee to pay all monies when due.
- b. On the first annual anniversary date of this Agreement and each annual anniversary date thereafter during the term of this Agreement the annual rent may be adjusted upwards, at the Lessor's sole discretion, of not more than 2% the current rent. Lessor shall notify Lessee of its election to adjust the annual rent.
- c. Lessee additionally agrees to pay any fees hereafter described.

4. Obligations of Lessee

- a. Lessee accepts the Leased Premises in its present condition and, without expense to the Lessor, will maintain any installations thereon.
- b. Lessee agrees to maintain the structure occupied by them/it and the surrounding premises in good order and make such repairs as are necessary to keep the Leased Premises in an operable condition acceptable to the Lessor and in a manner to preserve and protect the general appearance and value of other premises in the Airport.
- c. Lessee agrees that there will be no outside storage of equipment, materials, supplies, or damaged or partially dismantled aircraft on the Leased Premises, and Lessee will remove at its expense all trash, garbage, and drained oil. Lessee further agrees not to deposit the same on any part of the Airport, except temporarily in conjunction with collection or removal.
- d. Lessee agrees to provide its own connections with utilities and to make separate arrangements with the agencies responsible for these utilities. Lessee shall pay for all utility service supplied to the Leased Premises, and if required by the utility agencies as a condition of providing the services, Lessee will install and pay for standard metering devices for the measurement of such services. In the event it shall become necessary to make utility service or facility changes, Lessee will either make such changes and installations, at its expense, as directed and required by the utility organizations, or pay the utility organization for such changes made. Lessor shall have the right, without cost to Lessee, to install and maintain in, on or across the Leased Premises, sewer, water, gas, electric, and telephone lines, electric substations, or other installations necessary to the operation of the Airport, or to service other tenants or the City of Prairie du Chien; provided, however, that the Lessor shall carry out such work and locate any above-ground structures in a manner so as not to unreasonably interfere with Lessee's use of the Leased Premises.
- e. Lessee agrees that in the event of fire or any other casualty, to or on the Leased Premises, Lessee shall either repair or replace the hangar or remove the damaged

The Common Council authorized a timber harvest in 2023 contracting with Driftless Forestry. On October 8 bids were received for the harvest. The high bidder was Wieland & Sons for \$136,890.00.

For this timber harvest I would recommend after the payment of 12% to Driftless Forestry placing the remaining sales from the harvest in the LaRiviere Park Fund for future projects at the park.

CREATING CHAPTER 10.06 NUISANCE CAMPING PROHIBITED ON CITY- AND GOVERNMENT-OWNED PROPERTY OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF PRAIRIE DU CHIEN, CRAWFORD COUNTY, WISCONSIN

Purpose: The purpose of this Ordinance is to regulate camping in certain areas

The Common Council of the City of Prairie du Chien, Crawford County, Wisconsin, does ordain as follows:

Section 1: That Chapter 10.06 (NUISANCE CAMPING PROHIBITED ON CITY- AND GOVERNMENT-OWNED PROPERTY) of the Municipal Code of the City of Prairie du Chien, Wisconsin be created to read as follows:

10.06 (NUISANCE CAMPING PROHIBITED ON CITY- AND GOVERNMENT-OWNED PROPERTY)

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to camp as defined herein on city-owned property. Camping means to establish or maintain, at any time during the day or night, a temporary or permanent place for cooking or sleeping with the intent to remain in that location overnight.

Section 2: PENALTIES. Violation of this Ordinance or any part thereof with the shall be punishable under Section 25.04 of the Municipal Code of the City of Prairie du Chien.

Section 3: This Ordinance shall be effective from and after its passage and publication as required by law.

The City of Prairie du Chien has completed the selection process for PDC SRT 2025-2029. One bid was received which was from our current Shared Ride Taxi Service Provider, Running, Inc. All of the required steps issued by the Wisconsin DOT were adhered to by our Evaluation Committee whose members include Kyle Teynor, Robbie Fuller, Allie Thorton, and myself: Nate Gilberts.

The Evaluation Committee recommends the Common Council approve the Shared Ride Taxi service to Running Inc., and direct City Staff to draft and execute said contract.
